#### **HOW DID THIS TOW THING GET STARTED?**

There have been so many new affiliates of TOW added in the last couple of years that it would be a good idea to revisit the beginnings of how TOW got started.

First of all, TOW stands for Teardroppers of Oregon and Washington. This is a good moniker for a bunch of people who "tow" their teardrop trailers.

The beginning really started in 1998. That was the year of the very first teardrop gathering in the Pacific Northwest. It was the Open House for the LeMay automobile collection in Tacoma, Washington.

The LeMay gathering is a sidebar to the story. The founder of this teardrop gathering had visited the 1997 Open House and after attending the 1998 Shasta Dam gathering, thought how neat it would be for teardroppers to experience the LeMay collection as part of a gathering weekend. Contact was then made with one of the LeMay staff. While the staff member was conducting a tour of LeMay's Marymount Campus, the man himself, Harold LeMay, turned up driving around the campus in one of his vintage pickups. When it was explained to him that teardroppers wanted to visit the Open House while camping at a local park, Harold said, "Well, why don't you just camp here?" So, that's how the LeMay Open House gathering got started. It continues today with the ninth gathering happening this summer.

All teardrop trailer owners experience the fascination the general public has with our icon of the past. This happened every year at the LeMay Open House when our trailers were on display. At this time in history, the Northwest Car Collectors Association were asking their 32 member car clubs to put up theme-type displays during their annual Car Show and Swap Meet held every October. The NWCCA was approached with the idea that teardrop trailers could be displayed. So, it happened in the fall of 2000. It was a smashing success with lots of interest as spectators viewed our trailers. After this first show, an unexpected check made out to "Teardrop trailers" was received. And, it happened all over again in the year 2001.

As we were cleaning up the display that year, the show manager asked us to petition for full membership. One wonders how a trailer group ever got into a car collectors association, but during the petition presentation, it was emphasized that vintage cars pull a lot of teardrop trailers. But, there are responsibilities along with membership in NWCCA. We were accepted as members in March 2002. But, as they say, there is no such thing as a "free lunch" - we have over 35 duty hours to fulfill during the October show.

So, we had to have a name. After thinking of many variations, it was decided that it should be Teardroppers of Oregon and Washington – or TOW. The name is registered with the State of Oregon, it has a free checking account with the Bank of America and, at the encouragement of a Washington teardropper couple, the TOW Line newsletter was started.

The NWCCA shares the net take from the show and swap meet with the member clubs. Usually, a \$1000 check is received. After a three-person committee examines all expenses for the TOW operating year, all proceeds are divided between events held in Oregon and Washington. To this end, an

accounting is published each year in the TOW Line. The biggest expense happens for the October car show – mainly for decorations and when permanent fixtures are added to the display. TOW pays gas money for those driving over 50 miles to help with the display and to pull duty hours. Food such as breakfasts, lunches, snacks and beverages are also an expense.

Since it's beginning, TOW now has its own web site (<a href="www.teardroptrailers.org">www.teardroptrailers.org</a>) and about 300 affiliates, 273 of which receive the TOW Line via e-mail with snail-mail for the rest. TOW is not an official organization or club. That's way we have "affiliates" and not members. And best of all, we only have one or two meeting a year. These are at the campout gatherings where the host acts as the presiding "officer".

#### MIDWINTER POTLUCK = LOTS OF FUN

This year's edition was great fun. Lots of food and lots of visiting with fellow teardroppers was the order of the day. It seemed that it was a continuation of our times together at the campouts and gatherings we attend each year. New visitors were in abundance with one bringing a very LARGE serving of ribs.

The summer's calendar was reviewed. The same number of mistakes were pointed out, the first being the date of the midwinter potluck (listed as the Saturday before!). Ed Kelson was seen at a table with a calendar deciding on which weekend he and Linda would hosting their annual gathering.

#### TEARDROP SEEN AT THE PORTLAND SWAP MEET

Seen for the first time was the Liberty Fiberglass Teardrop Trailer. It's a white trailer with molded fenders. It reminds one of the 1947 Kit when looking at its overall size. It's a very, very clean looking teardrop and with the body being molded in one piece, there are no leaks to contend with. The door is ample in size and looks like it has a top quality seal. It comes with an escape window on the left side.

This trailer is available as an assembled unit or, as an optional assembly, can be a "do it yourself" project. All parts are available starting with the body that includes the frame and galley lid. From then on, lots of options are available. The brochure states that the dry weight is 885 pounds. Tongue weight is just 100 pounds. And, one of the features is a torsion-bar suspension.
