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


2013 Event Details

<u>Twain and Tears.</u> The gathering will be at a small park on the grounds of a shack where Mark Twain lived while prospecting in the boomtown of Unionville. Unionville is a tiny hamlet boasting about 20 full time residents in the Buena Vista Canyon, about 20 miles off I-80 between Lovelock and Winnemucca. It is close to 150 miles from Reno. We will camp in a county park mid-village called "Moeha Walker Memorial Park."

The park is free, with water and porta-potty. No electricity or showers. Camping will be group informal and family style; this is not a campground but a park which we have permission to use. The canyon is about 500 feet higher in elevation than Lovelock, so a bit cooler, and it is quiet, quiet, quiet. There is only one road in and out. No cell phone coverage, although there are land lines so emergency service is available at a local home or the inn. Park will hold maybe 15-20 trailers maximum.

Great gadget

Tired of plastic bins? You know you have it somewhere, but which half –cracked one-trick pony is it in, and how far down in this mess could it possibly be, did I really put a measuring tape in here, whose idea was it to stick a roll of twine in with, well, everything?

Enter the Camp Chef Sherpa Camp table and Organizer. It takes up about the same amount of room as a large plastic bin, but has a roll out table top so you can use it as a table and the legs collapse for easy entry into the teardrop. One of the fabric bins has thermo lining so it is perfect for butter or produce, really anything that you don't want to freeze in the cooler, but could benefit from some light temperature control. I use one bin for things like kitchen goods and split up hardware (tent stakes, drop cord, bungees) in the others. 4.6 out of 5 stars on Amazon. Be careful with the price though, I have seen it at \$72 and \$235, obviously one is a decent buy and one is plain crazy.

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Camp Craft

I love hand knitted dishcloths. But I'm not a huge fan of the kind made from worsted weight cotton. Yes, they are better than store bought dishcloths, but they can get very bulky. I noticed a friend of mine knitting a dishcloth from a single strand of crochet cotton. Of course I had to try my hand at knitting some, and I was well rewarded. The scrubbing power was wonderful, and they were closer to the size of a store-bought dishcloth. But they took so long to knit. Then, at a friend's bridal shower, I was struck by a certain gift: dishcloths knitted from two strands of crochet cotton. Brilliant! So, I created this pattern. It knits up much quicker than using a single strand, but it still has that lovely scrubbing action! This pattern is a very good "mindless" knitting project. Grab yourself some crochet cotton and knitting needles, and take it wherever you go!

Not Your Ordinary Knitted Dishcloth Pattern

Materials:

- 2 balls of size 10 crochet cotton in contrasting colors of choice
- 1 pair of straight knitting needles, US size 2 or 3, depending on how tightly you knit

Gauge:

Not critical

Directions:

Holding the 2 strands of crochet cotton together, cast on 3 stitches.

Begin increasing:

Row 1: knit.

Row 2: knit 1, yarn over, knit to end of row.

Repeat row 2 until you have 77 stitches, or until desired size is obtained.

Begin decreasing:

Next row: knit 2 together, yarn over, knit 2 together, knit to end of row.

Repeat this row until there are 4 stitches remaining.

Next row: knit 2 together, bind off all stitches.

Finishing:

Weave in all loose ends. Wash before first use.

- 1/4 cup butter, cubed
- 2 packages (20 ounces each) refrigerated shredded hash brown potatoes
- 1 package (7 ounces) brown-and-serve sausage links, cut into 1/2-inch pieces
- 1/4 cup chopped onion
- 1/4 cup chopped green pepper
- 12 eggs, lightly beaten
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 cup (4 ounces) shredded cheddar cheese

Directions

- In a large skillet, melt butter. Add the potatoes, sausage, onion and green pepper. Cook, uncovered, over medium heat for 10-15 minutes or until potatoes are lightly browned, turning once
- Push potato mixture to the sides of pan. Pour eggs into center of pan. Cook and stir over medium
 heat until eggs are completely set. Season with salt and pepper. Reduce heat; stir eggs into potato
 mixture. Top with cheese; cover and cook for 1-2 minutes or until cheese is melted
