Campground recommendation



Brian Wood, who has recently started a British Columbia chapter of Tear Jerkers, recommends Conconully, a Washington State park located 22 miles north of Omak. Conconully State Park is an 81-acre camping park with 5,400 feet of freshwater shoreline in north central Washington. Established as the oldest Bureau of Reclamation irrigation project in this part of the country, the park dates back to 1910. State Parks assumed administration in 1945.

The park has 51 tent spaces, 15 water/electric sites, five cabins, four

restrooms (one ADA) and four showers (one ADA). Maximum site length is 60 feet (may have limited availability). Five water/electric campsites (56D - 60D) are available by reservation. To make a reservation, visit online or call (888) CAMPOUT or (888) 226-7688. All other campsites are first come, first served.

POPSTICKS Roasting Stick. They are completely self-contained, so I never have to worry about them tearing things during packing. They stood up to 5 kids and me cooking hot dogs and marshmallows. Cleaned up easily. Oh and the cover can be used to extend the handle for the little ones! They come in six colors, at Overstock.com and popsticks.com

CAMPFIRE TREATS



<u>Bacon S'mores</u> - Give the traditional s'more a salty, smoky twist by saving some bacon from breakfast and sandwiching it between the marshmallows and chocolate

<u>Chocolate Cake Baked in an Orange</u> - Cut the tops off about 10 oranges and scoop out the pulp. Fill the oranges three-quarters of the way with chocolate cake batter (cake mix works fine), then put the orange tops back on and wrap each orange in aluminum foil. Place directly onto the smoldering coals of the campfire, avoiding any intense flames, and cook for about 30 minutes, turning once or twice.

<u>Campfire Cherry Cobbler</u> - Empty two 21-ounce cans of cherry pie filling into the bottom of a greased Dutch oven and cover with Bisquick shortcake batter. Put the lid on and place the pot directly onto the smoldering coals of the campfire, avoiding any intense flames. Cook for 30 minutes, rotating every few minutes.

How to: Put a "Window" in your canopy wall

Disclaimer: The wall is lying on my kitchen table right now, I have yet to actually do all of it, and by the Gorge Gathering we will know how it worked out.

Last year I was at IRG and it was COLD and windy. We ended up hanging a tarp on the windward side, and managed to get warm. The problem? Sure we were warmer, but we couldn't see, and part of what I like about camping is the scenery. This year I plan to be better armed. I am putting a strip of clear vinyl in my canopy wall. This way I will be able to see out, but still have the wind protection.

What you need:

- ➤ 1 canopy wall Mine is 10 feet wide
- Enough double stick tape to hold the vinyl in place while you sew – I am using the kind that sail makers use
- Heavy duty thread
- ➤ A heavy fabric needle I am using a 16
- A writing device that can be wiped or rinsed off
- Rubbing alcohol

- > A sewing machine
- 20 gauge vinyl Mine is 54 inches wide, and I bought 3 yards
- Scissors
- Scotch-type tape
- A yard stick (optional)
- 1. Take the wall and lay it out on a table.
- 2. Mark out lines to use for a guide
- 3. Stick one side of the doublestick to the wall following the inside of the line
- 4. Peeling back the top side of the tape back attach the window to the wall
- 5. Continue in this manner all the way around the window, making sure that the vinyl is tight against the wall fabric, smoothing as you go
- 6. Attach the scotch-type tape to the bottom of the sewing machine foot (this will make the vinyl slide under the foot easier)
- 7. Sew around the window vinyl side up (there seems to be some controversy about zig-zag or two rows of straight stich, I am pretty sure either would be fine)
- 8. Every couple of feet clean the needle with rubbing alcohol (the goo from the double stick is not good for the sewing machine)
- 9. Cut out the area of the wall that is now backed with vinyl, taking care to not nick the vinyl

Notes:

The walls are not really that thick, you should be OK without a heavy duty sewing machine, but your mileage may vary

The double stick tape is VERY sticky it could hold the window on its own, but don't make that mistake, the first time it gets warm that will be the end of your window and the tape




2013 Event Details

<u>Twain and Tears.</u> The gathering will be at a small park on the grounds of a shack where Mark Twain lived while prospecting in the boomtown of Unionville. Unionville is a tiny hamlet boasting about 20 full time residents in the Buena Vista Canyon, about 20 miles off I-80 between Lovelock and Winnemucca. It is close to 150 miles from Reno. We will camp in a county park mid-village called "Moeha Walker Memorial Park."

The park is free, with water and porta-potty. No electricity or showers. Camping will be group informal and family style; this is not a campground but a park which we have permission to use. The canyon is about 500 feet higher in elevation than Lovelock, so a bit cooler, and it is quiet, quiet, quiet. There is only one road in and out. No cell phone coverage, although there are land lines so emergency service is available at a local home or the inn. Park will hold maybe 15-20 trailers maximum.

Directions: To get to Unionville, take the Mill City/Unionville exit off Interstate 80 onto Nevada State Highway 400. Drive about 17 miles on paved road, look for the Unionville sign on your right as the highway turns into a well-graded gravel road. The village is located about three miles up the road into the canyon. Keep going until you spot the park on the right. There is only one road in and out of the village.
