- Spray the Cooker with something anti-stick
- Place refrigerator biscuits around the bottom of the cooker
- Add some of the browned sausage
- Add some of the gravy
- Repeat
- Cooking time in a Slow Cooker is High for Two hours

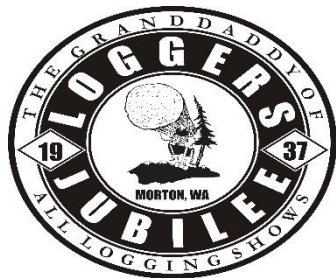
## August 7-9 Brooks, Oregon

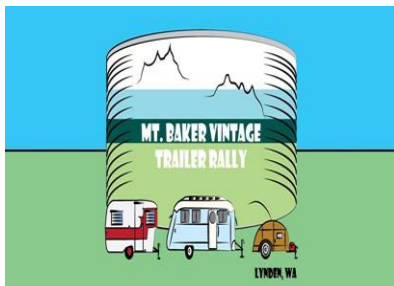
### Wapato Showdown
